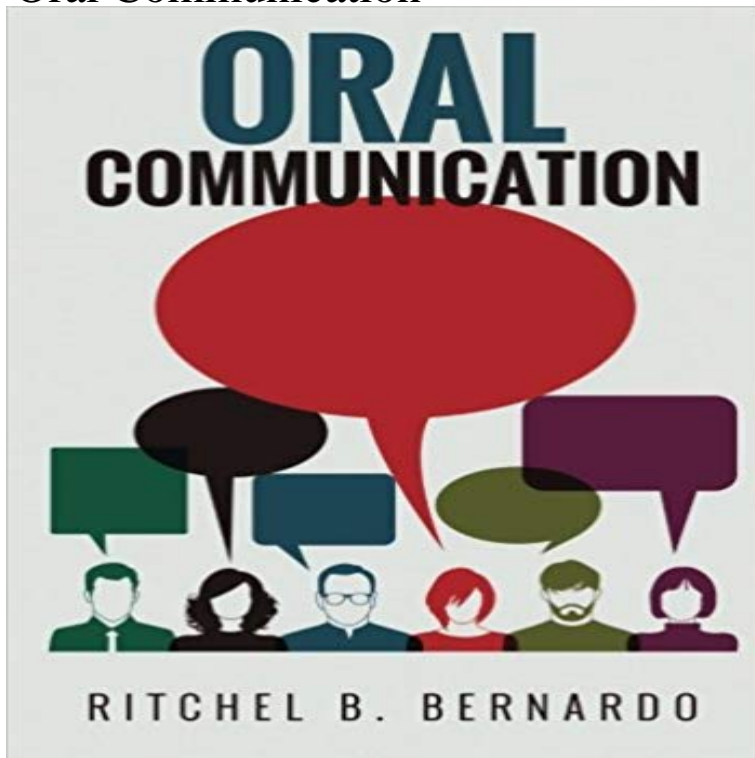


Oral Communication
