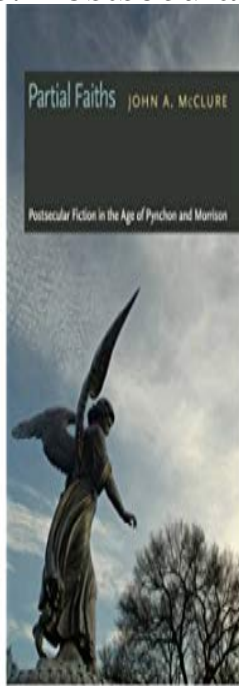


Partial Faiths: Postsecular Fiction In The Age Of Pynchon And Morrison
